Dr. Kathryn Kipp and Dr. Gina Corrigan will join Dr. Cherinet Seid, Dr. Hanene Ben Amor and Nurse Practitioners Craig O'Brien and Kirstie O'Brien at NRFHT, located in the clinic building adjacent to the Deep River and District Hospital. Their anticipated start dates are November 1, 2013 and February 1, 2014, respectively.

"Drs. Kipp and Corrigan will bring the FHT to its full complement of physicians for the first time since its inception in 2006. The clinicians and staff are pleased with this news and look forward to working with them", states Jennifer Kennedy, Executive Director of the Family Health Team. North Renfrew Family Health Team is one of the 182 Family Health Teams of Ontario. Family Health Teams provide enrolled patients with a range of services, including basic primary care (immunizations, annual check-ups, care for acute illness) provided by both doctors and nurse practitioners. Enrolled patients can also receive services from a pharmacist, dietitians, and a social worker.

As of November 1, 2013, North Renfrew Family Health Team will be accepting new patients in the region stretching from Bissett Creek to Chalk River. If you live within the postal codes of KOJ 1PO, KOJ 1JO, KOJ 2BO, KOJ 2HO, KOJ 1EO, KOJ 2KO, and KOJ 1RO and do not have a family physician, we can provide you with one.
