

It is my privilege to provide you with your new council's first update in this community magazine. Council's first months have been busy getting acquainted and bringing ourselves up-to-speed on legislation and municipal issues. An election is always a great opportunity to get a good sense of what you, the citizens of our community, believe is important for our future. Your council is capitalizing on that momentum along with the outpouring of ideas. We are working with staff to articulate and gain consensus on strategic priorities and identify actions to start achieving these priorities.

Internet

Council heard loud and clear the concerns of our citizens regarding slow internet speeds in our community and the barrier this is creating to citizen's quality of life and the growth of the municipality. Council and staff are actively engaged in discussions with a local provider to quickly bring improved internet. Stay tuned!!!

Housing

There is new rental housing coming to Deep River! As announced in late November 2018, Tim Streek, of TSH Development Group, has announced plans to build a multi-unit rental apartment building, consisting primarily of 2 bedroom, barrier free units, at the corner of Poplar Street and Montcalm Street in the heart of downtown Deep River. TSH along with municipal and county staff are currently working on the details of the apartment complex and site plan design, targeting completion in late 2020.

Deep River will also soon see the final results of the Phase 2 redevelopment of 23 units in the Kerryhill Court property on Tamarack Street. These fully refurbished units will be coming on-line later this year.

With a growing young population, as well as, many seniors looking for updated or renovated housing, there are good opportunities for both developers and handy house flippers to make a reasonable return on investment and contribute to Deep River's growth. Individuals with a sense of entrepreneurship may want to consider working together to advance such initiatives.

CNL Site Revitalization

A lot is going on at CNL's Chalk River campus including the recent award of several major new build projects, bringing significant investment and construction activity to this area over the next few years. CNL has also announced further progress in the steps to site one or more Small Modular Reactors. Deep River is working closely with AECL and CNL, supporting the initiatives of our largest employer and taxpayer.

Administration

This year will see activity, once again, at the Laurentianview Dairy property. Caroline Roberts, President and CEO and Dr. Ben Quine, Chief Technical Officer with Thoth Technology Inc. have purchased the Laurentianview Dairy and plan to locate their aerospace research company to Deep River complemented by a new restaurant featuring an outer-space theme. Finance

Property Tax

There are two tax billings annually consisting of 4 payments (interim bill is based on half the taxes from the previous year). The interim bill is sent out the first week of February. Installment one was due on February 28th, 2019 and the second installment is due May 31st, 2019. The final bill is sent out the first week of August with installments due the last business day of August and November.

Water and Sewer

The first installment of the water and sewer billing is due April 30th, 2019. It covers the period of January 1st – June 30th, 2019. The second installment of the water and sewer billing is due October 31st, 2019. It covers the period of July 1st – December 31st, 2019.

A Preauthorized Payment Plan is available to pay Town of Deep River taxes as well as water and sewer bills.



FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Town of Deep River Fire Department would like to remind residents of the following:

- Test your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, change batteries immediately if needed.
- Check your fire extinguishers.
- * Check for overloaded or damaged extension cords, replace where needed.
- * Ensure you have an emergency preparedness kit in case of incidents such as power outages and flooding.
- Practice your families fire escape plan so everyone knows what to do in case of an emergency.
- * Windows should be checked to ensure they open and close properly, in case they are needed as an exit.
- Properly store household chemicals and never mix cleaning agents.
- Recycle: Get rid of old newspapers, magazines and junk mail. These items tend to pile up and can greatly contribute to the severity and spread of fire.
- * Check and clean filters above stove.
- Pull refrigerator out and vacuum or dust the coils.
- * Always keep stairs and landings clear for safe evacuation in event of an emergency.

AROUND THE HOUSE

Make sure your address numbers are up and visible from the street.



Maintain a clear 'fire zone' of 10 feet around structures.

Check outdoor electrical outlets and other electrical appliances for animal nests and ensure proper wiring.

Keep 100 feet of garden hose with an attached nozzle connected and ready for use.

Remove leaves and trash from carports and garages: Combustible materials are dangerous if they are exposed to heated automobile components, especially under the vehicle.

Clean up and properly store paints, pool and yard chemicals.

Check fuel containers for leaks and make sure they are properly stored.

Let power equipment sit for approximately 30 minutes before placing it inside, to be sure there is no possibility of fire.



- √ All barbeque grills must only be used outdoors using grills indoors or in enclosed spaces is not only a fire hazard, but it exposes occupants to toxic gasses and potential asphyxiation.
- √ Always position the grill well away from combustible objects buildings, fences, deck railings and landscaping can easily and quickly ignite.
- √ Get your grill cleaned and serviced. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage.
- √ Never leave a lit grill unattended.
- √ Always use long handled grilling utensils and heat resistant oven mitts to avoid exposure burns from heat and flames.
- √ Periodically remove grease build-up in catch trays to prevent it from igniting.
- √ Keep a garden hose nearby, connected and ready for use in case of a fire.

Deep River Building Department

The Building Code is an important piece of legislation in Ontario when it comes to renovating your home or building a new one. The Town's CBO will ensure that your building meets all Provincial requirements while keeping your safety and your residence's future occupants safety a top priority.

SPRING CLEAN UP 2019

The annual spring clean-up will commence on the following dates:



Monday May 6th—EAST END Monday May 13th—WEST END

YARD WASTE

- Branches and Brush in biodegradable bags or bundled and tied.
- Leaf and Yard Waste in biodegradable bags

METAL

- ♦ Pipes, Ductwork, etc...
- Propane Tanks (VALVE OPEN)
- Metal Appliances

ELECTRONIC WASTE



Please ensure items are placed at the curb by 7:30 PM the day before collection begins in your area. Items may be set out as early as one week in advance of the scheduled pick up.

In accordance with By-Law Number 10-2012, no person shall use, or permit the use of any land or structure within the Town of Deep River for dumping, disposing or accumulating of garbage, refuse, or domestic or industrial waste of any kind. Refuse **must be contained on your property**. Please do not deposit waste on vacant lots or parkland. During spring clean-up, please place material on the shoulder of the road next to your driveway.

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP INCLUDE:

Household garbage, recyclable materials, cardboard, construction and demolition material of any kind, furniture, mattresses and box springs, carpets, large tree limbs/trunks/stumps, plastic toys, tires or household hazardous waste (HHHW) such as motor oil, gasoline, paint cans, batteries, antifreeze, etc., and any other items not listed in the accepted items list.

WATERING RESTRICTIONS APPLY FROM MAY 1ST UNTIL SEPTEMBER 30TH (INCLUSIVE).

Addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8 may water their lawns on "even numbered calendar dates", i.e.: May 2nd, June 30th, July 18th, and August 6th. Addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 may water their lawns on "odd numbered calendar dates", i.e., June 3rd, July 15th, August 21st, and September 7th. The permitted hours on watering days are: 7:30 AM to 11:00 AM and 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM.

FALL YARD WASTE PICK UP - NOVEMBER 4th - 8th, 2019

Public Works staff will collect yard waste the week of November 4th - 8th, 2019. Leaves, Pine needles and plants must be placed at the curb in biodegradable bags by 7:00 AM on November 4th, 2019. Tree branches and other brush will not be picked up but can be taken to the Baggs Road Landfill site throughout the year at no charge.

Only one pass will be made for each street so please ensure that your bags are out ahead of time. We will do our best to pick up broken bags but will not rake contents that have been spilled out of bags (Note: Do not place bags out prior to Halloween night).

Christmas Tree Disposal



Christmas Trees may be placed curbside making sure not to interfere with waste collection, recycle collection or snow removal services. The Town will ensure that all Christmas trees placed at the curbside will be collected by January 17th, 2020. Alternatively, Christmas trees can be dropped off free of charge at the Baggs Road Landfill site.

Hydrant Flushing Notice




Please be advised that hydrant flushing will occur in the spring and fall of 2019, as well as, the spring of 2020. These dates will be available on the Town of Deep River website www.deepriver.ca and in the North Renfrew Times.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your COLD WATER TAPS ONLY (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please DO NOT use your hot water until you have clear running water again.
