

Helping You During the COVID-19 Pandemic

The Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre (RC VTAC) is a new pandemic healthcare service to reduce the demand on Emergency Departments and provide Renfrew County residents, who do not have a family physician or cannot access their family physician, with the appropriate level of care when they have any health concern (including concerns related to COVID-19).



Accessible for any Renfrew County resident who has a health concern (including concerns related to COVID-19) and does not have a family physician or cannot access their family physician.

- Call 1-844-727-6404
- Have your OHIP card ready
- A medical receptionist will take your details and arrange for a physician or nurse practitioner to contact you via telephone.

The RC VTAC is a virtual solution that allows nurse practitioners, physicians and/or community paramedics to assess and manage health concerns in multiple ways depending on a person's needs.

This includes:

- Phone appointments
- Video appointments
- In-home assessments and diagnostic testing by community paramedics
- Remote monitoring and alerting and if necessary, escalation to a designated team of physicians and allied health professionals for the management of patients with COVID-19
- Referral to other services including mental health support

3.8 Undesirable Uses

3.8.1 KEEPING ANIMALS

No animals, other than household pets, shall be kept in any zone other than for animal husbandry in the undeveloped zone and for non-commercial animal husbandry in the Estate Residential Zone.



DEEP RIVER FIRE DEPARTMENT

All outdoor fires in Ontario restricted during the COVID-19 pandemic

The province of Ontario government is taking action to protect people and communities from the risk of preventable human-caused fires and to ensure that the province's emergency response system remains strong during the COVID-19 outbreak. Starting April 3rd, Ontario's entire legislated fire region will be designated a Restricted Fire Zone. Residents who live in an area with a restricted fire zone cannot have an outdoor fire—this includes burning of grass, debris and campfires, even when using an outdoor fire grate, fireplace or fire pit.

Minister of Natural Resources and Forestry and local MPP John Yakabuski says during this very challenging time when we are fighting the spread of the virus, our number one priority is the health and safety of the people of Ontario. He adds they're putting these important preventative measures in place now to ensure that our emergency responders are able to focus their efforts where they are needed most.

This restriction will remain in place until Ontario's ability to respond to emergencies is no longer impacted by the COVID-19 outbreak. Local municipalities are working to update their websites with information for residents.
