TREE LIMB COLLECTION

Due to the major snow storm on April 9, 2019, the Public Works Department will be collecting and chipping fallen tree branches throughout the Town leading up to the May 6, 2019 Spring Cleanup Collection.

Spring cleanup dates remain unchanged and will begin May 6th (east end) and May 13th (west end); however, with the significant tree damage from the storm, staff will be collecting and chipping tree limbs only over the next 2 weeks. Please ensure that only branches are placed at the roadside and that all of the butts (larger ends) are at the same end. Thank you in advance for your help.

Locates

When excavating to install fences, repair driveways, plant trees, etc., contact Ontario One Call before you dig by either using the online locate form https://www.on1call.com/ or call 1-800-400-2255 for Town of Deep River water/sewer, Bell, Enbridge Gas, Cogeco Cable and Hydro One locates.

A commonly asked question in Deep River: I have locate paint on my property, and I did not request a locate. Can you tell me who did?

A: Excavators request locates for a variety of reasons. Cities dig to repair water and sewer lines or rebuild roads/sidewalks.

Infrastructure owners dig to repair or upgrade their lines, etc.

Please keep in mind that the municipality you live in, technically, "owns" the land up to your property line. If they must excavate on the publicly owned portion of the property, they may do so without consulting you first.

While there is no arguing that you own your private property, the infrastructure buried underneath that property are owned by the respective owner.

It is the policy of most companies and certainly a courtesy to notify you of any planned excavation.

ON1Call's Privacy Policy forbids ON1Call Representatives from discussing locate requests with anyone but the person who requested the locate, an ON1Call member, or a third party investigative body/legal body.

If you are requesting a property line locate as part of a Town building permit process, please contact the Public Works Department at 613-584-2000 ext. 107.

Know how to recognize a scam

With tax season upon us criminals are going to attempt to defraud anyone they can and there are many fraud types including new ones invented daily.

Taxpayers should be vigilant when they receive, either by telephone, mail, text message or email, a fraudulent communication that claims to be from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) requesting personal information such as a social insurance number, credit card number, bank account number, or passport number.

These scams may insist that this personal information is needed so that the taxpayer can receive a refund or a benefit payment. Cases of fraudulent communication could also involve threatening or coercive language to scare individuals into paying fictitious debt to the CRA.

Other communications urge taxpayers to visit a fake CRA website where the taxpayer is then asked to verify their identity by entering personal information. These are scams and taxpayers should never respond to these fraudulent communications or click on any of the links provided.
