WATERING RESTRICTIONS APPLY FROM MAY 1 - SEPT 30 (INCLUSIVE).

A watering permit issued by the Town of Deep River will only allow you to water within the permitted hours each day. Watering permits do not permit all day watering.

Addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8 may water their lawns on “even numbered calendar dates”, i.e.: May 2nd, June 30th, July 18th, and August 6th.

Addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 may water their lawns on “odd numbered calendar dates”, i.e., June 3rd, July 15th, August 21st, and September 7th.

The “Permitted Hours” are: 7:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. only.

PROPERTY TAX DEFERRAL PROGRAM

The Town of Deep River has implemented a deferral program for the May 29, 2020 interim property tax bill payment for residential property owners and small businesses that have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- The deadline to submit this application is June 15, 2020.
- This application form must be completed by the owner(s) of the property.
- Property owner(s) that have tenants will only be eligible if they pass on financial relief/deferral to their tenants

Town of Deep River BEACHES NOW OPEN

COVID-19 Precautions Mandatory

The Town of Deep River staff would like to apologize for the recent confusion regarding last week’s closure of the beaches to the public. Rapidly changing and sometimes unclear direction in the Provincial orders led to a misinterpretation of the Provincial order on beaches.

Deep River beaches are now officially open provided the Public Health guidelines including physical distancing are followed, as we work to limit the spread of COVID-19 in our community. As in past years both beaches Pinepoint and Lamure are open with a “use at your own risk” condition. This means that no Lifeguarding will be provided at this time, Lifeguarding and potential programs at Lamure Beach will be revisited at the end of June.

Social Gatherings on beaches of more than five (5) people are prohibited by O.Reg.52/20.
