ZONING BY-LAW

3.8 Undesirable Uses
3.8.1 Keeping Animals

No animals, other than household pets, shall be kept in any zone other than for animal husbandry in the undeveloped zone and for non-commercial animal husbandry in the Estate Residential Zone.

Chickens or other animals that are not pets are not allowed in Residential zoning.

SMOKE ALARM and CARBON MONOXIDE INSPECTIONS

for residents and businesses with a Highway 17 address **during the week of May 5.**

These inspections will take place during the day/evening hours. Please contact the Fire Department (613-584-2000 ext. 190) if you have any questions.

Failure to comply with the Fire Code smoke alarm requirements could result in a ticket for \$360 or a fine of up to \$50,000 for individuals or \$100,000 for corporations.

Non-compliance with the regulations for installing a carbon monoxide alarm is a ticket-able offence and under this process (a ticket) the fine is \$235. If a Part 3 process is utilized the maximum fine is up to \$5,000.

SPRING CLEAN-UP

EAST END, Monday, May 6 • WEST END, Monday, May 13

- **YARD WASTE**
 - Branches & Brush in biodegradable bags or bundled and tied
 - Leaf and Yard Waste in biodegradable bags
- **METAL**
 - Pipes, ductwork, etc.
 - Propane Tanks (empty, valve open)
 - Metal appliances
- **ELECTRONIC WASTE**

Please ensure items are placed at the curb by 7:30 PM the day before collection begins in your area. Items may be set out as early as one week in advance of the scheduled pick up.

In accordance with By-Law No. 10-2012, no person shall use, or permit the use of, any land or structure within the Town of Deep River for dumping, disposing or accumulating of garbage, refuse, or domestic or industrial waste of any kind. **Refuse must be contained on your property.**

Please do not deposit waste on vacant lots or parkland. During spring clean-up please place material on the shoulder of the road next to your driveway.

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP INCLUDE:

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE, RECYCLABLE MATERIALS, CARDBOARD, CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION MATERIAL OF ANY KIND, FURNITURE, MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS, CARPETS, LARGE TREE LIMBS/TRUNKS/STUMPS, PLASTIC TOYS, TIRES OR HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHHW) SUCH AS MOTOR OIL, GASOLINE, PAINT CANS, BATTERIES, ANTIFREEZE, ETC., AND ANY OTHER ITEMS NOT LISTED IN THE ACCEPTED ITEMS LIST.

HYDRANT FLUSHING NOTICE

Please be advised that hydrant flushing will commence:

West end - Monday, May 6th – Friday, May 17

East end - Tuesday, May 21– Friday, May 31

Flushing will continue over a four week period as part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain fire fighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your **COLD WATER TAPS ONLY** (suggested taps: bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please **DO NOT** use your hot water until you have clean running water again.

WATERING RESTRICTIONS

apply from May 1 - Sept 30 (inclusive)

Addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8 may water their lawns on "even numbered calendar dates", i.e.: May 2, June 30, July 18, and August 6.

Addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 may water their lawns on "odd numbered calendar dates", i.e.: June 3, July 15, August 21, and September 7.

The "Permitted Hours" are: 7:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. only.
