PUBLIC NOTICE

The Deep River Wastewater Treatment Plant is running at full capacity due to the spring run-off. Water conservation will help reduce the risk of the plant operating over capacity during this year's spring melt.

The Town of Deep River asks residents to assist with this matter.

Here are some helpful ways that you can reduce your water consumption at home:

Reduce your shower time: Taking as little as 3 minutes off of your shower time will help to reduce water usage.

Turn off the faucet: You can conserve water and reduce the amount you are putting back into the system by turning off the faucet when you do not need water, such as while brushing your teeth, doing dishes, washing your face or cleaning. Don't let the faucet run while cleaning vegetables. Fill a jug with water and put it in your refrigerator rather than letting the water run from the faucet to get a cold drink.

Dish washing: Delay dish washing, use a dishwasher if you have one. Running a full dishwasher will use less water than washing the same number of dishes by hand.

Flush less: It's estimated that 75 percent of water used indoors is in the bathroom and a quarter of that is through toilets.

Check Faucets and Pipes for Leaks: A small drip from a worn faucet washer can waste 20 gallons of water per day. Larger leaks can waste hundreds of gallons. Some faucet leaks are easily spotted, but others take a little more effort to locate.

DEEP RIVER POLICE DEPARTMENT

POLICE WEEK: MAY 12 - 18

Police Week is an annual event that is focused on raising awareness about the great work of police services, and showcasing the diversity of roles across the profession.

As part of Police Week 2019, the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services wants to showcase the impactful work of different policing teams/units across the province, including those that the public does not see every day.

The Deep River Police has such positions within its organization that the public may not be aware of. Each and every officer that works for the Deep River Police has a secondary duty that is essential to the operation of the service.

Cst Marek Brela is also the Community Service Officer. This includes preparing presentations for various school groups, clubs and organizations on various topics.

Sgt Lehoux prepares monthly reports to meet standards on traffic report which includes HTA charges laid by our officers, number of vehicle accidents, traffic complaints, Municipal By-law, and Stats on RIDE Programs, driver licence suspensions and impaired driving offences.

Cst Ray is a Scenes of Crime officer. Within the scope of her duties as a SOCO, this includes taking fingerprints at a scene, footwear impression, blood samples for analysis and gathering, protecting & submitting evidence. Anne has also recently become the 2nd Officer in Deep River to be trained for the SOR (sex offender registry).

Cst Barker is the Use of Force and Firearms instructor. He is qualified



to do mandatory yearly training for Use of Force.

Cst Amanda Brela is DNA collection qualified. In some instances when a person has been charged and found guilty of a criminal offence a Judge will order that the offenders DNA be obtained and stored on file with the National DNA Data Bank. Cst Brela would collect a small amount of blood using a lancet on the person's finger and placing the blood on a collection card. The offender is also fingerprinted and buccal swabs (or cheek swabs) may also be collected. The collection samples are then submitted and stored by the National DNA Databank.

Cst Rob Medeiros is also Coach Officer for new police recruits, Firearms instructor for C-8 armoured (Colt Canada), Glock armoured (Glock Int), S&W armoured, Taser instructor (Taser International), CEW instructor (Ontario), Breath tech, Baton instructor (ASP), Use of Force instructor, and edged weapons instructor.

Cst Dave Newell is a media relations officer and qualified to enter subjects on the Sex Offender Registry.

Sgt Faris is the Domestic Violence coordinator, public complaints supervisor and police vehicle operations supervisor.

The Deep River Police officers have many more qualifications and courses which were not mentioned but if anyone wishes to know they are more than welcome to come to the station and speak to any officer.
