### Crime Prevention Week in Ontario

November 3 - 9, 2019

This year, the week of November 3 to 9, 2019, has been designated Crime Prevention Week in Ontario. As you know, Crime Prevention Week provides an opportunity to showcase the successful collaborative efforts between police services and community organizations as they work towards the common goal of preventing crime and creating safe, resilient communities across Ontario.

This year's provincial theme is "Preventing Crime, Protecting People." The theme enables police services to promote the benefits of not only a justice response, but a holistic community approach to addressing local crime and issues related to safety and well-being. It is important that the police continue to leverage the strengths of community partners to enhance frontline responses and ensure those in need receive the right response, at the right time, and by the right service provider. Everyone plays a role in preventing crime and keeping Ontarians safe!

Deep River Police is going to be releasing a Vulnerable Person registry where parents, guardians or other loved ones can provide specific information about a person who may have a tendency to wander. The information would then be used to quickly locate a wandering person and would include information such as physical descriptors, best approach methods and medical conditions the person may be suffering from. The information would also be shared with other agencies that may assist in locating the wandering/missing person such as local hospital or other police agency.

The forms will soon be available on the Police section of Town of Deep River website and at the Deep River Police station itself. They will also be available at partner agencies such as the Deep River Hospital.

We are looking forward to providing this service to the residents of Deep River.

## Beat the Silent Killer

Install and regularly test carbon monoxide alarms.



You must install a carbon monoxide alarm adjacent to all sleeping areas if your home has fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage.

## FALL YARD WASTE PICK UP

Monday, Nov 4th to Friday Nov 8th

Yard waste will be collected the week of November 4th-8th, 2019. Leaves, Pine needles and plants must be placed at the curb in biodegradable bags no later than 7:00 AM on November 4th, 2019.

We will do our best to pick up broken bags but will not rake contents that have been spilled out of bags, it is recommended not place bags out prior to Halloween night.

Tree branches and other brush will not be picked up but can be taken to the Baggs Road Landfill site throughout the year at no charge.

Only one pass will be made for each street so please ensure that you bags are out ahead of time.
