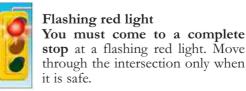

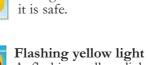

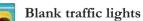
#### What to do when traffic lights are not working properly.





A flashing yellow light means you should DRIVE with caution when approaching and moving through

the intersection. DO NOT STOP unless it is necessary.



During an electrical power loss, traffic lights at intersections will not work. Yield the right-ofway to vehicles in the

intersection and to vehicles entering the intersection from your right.

Go cautiously and use the intersection the same way you would use an intersection with all-way stop signs.
