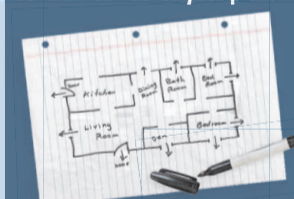

REMINDER

What to do when traffic lights are not working properly.



Flashing red light

You must come to a complete stop at a flashing red light. Move through the intersection only when it is safe.



Blank traffic lights

During an electrical power loss, traffic lights at intersections will not work. Yield the right-of-way to vehicles in the intersection and to vehicles entering the intersection from your right.

Go cautiously and use the intersection the same way you would use an intersection with all-way stop signs.



Flashing yellow light

A flashing yellow light means you should DRIVE with caution when approaching and moving through the intersection.

DO NOT STOP unless it is necessary.
