

NOTICE HYDRANT FLUSHING

Please be advised that hydrant flushing commenced in the **West end** of Town on Monday October 21st, 2019 and will begin in the **East end** of Town on October 28th, 2019.

Flushing is part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain firefighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your COLD WATER TAPS ONLY (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or

laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please **DO NOT** use your hot water until you have clean running water again.
