FALL YARD WASTE PICK UP NOVEMBER 2nd to November 6th, 2020

Yard waste will be collected the week of November 2-6, 2020. Leaves, Pine needles and plants must be placed at the curb in biodegradable bags no later than 7:00 AM on November 2nd, 2020.

We will do our best to pick up broken bags but will not rake contents that have been spilled out of bags. It is recommended not place bags out prior to Halloween night.

Tree branches and other brush will not be picked up but can be taken to the Bags Road Landfill site throughout the year at no charge.

Only one pass will be made for each street so please ensure that you bags are out no later than 7:00 AM on November 2nd, 2020.



HYDRANT FLUSHING NOTICE

West end of Town beginning Monday, October 5
East end of Town beginning Monday, October 19

Flushing is part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain firefighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your COLD WATER TAPS ONLY (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please **DO NOT** use your hot water until you have clean running water again.

DEEP RIVER FIRE DEPARTMENT

NO PERMIT, NO BURN

Recreational Fire shall mean a Fire that is set outdoors that is not an Open Air Fire, or Exempt Fire and that is maintained solely for providing warmth and recreational enjoyment.



Schedule "B" of By-Law 25-2020

Response rates for fire vehicles:

Per fire vehicle for the first hour or any part thereof \$200.00

Per fire vehicle for each additional 1/2 hour or part thereof \$100.00

Schedule "C" of By-Law 25-2020

Set/Allow Fire - No Permit \$250.00

Set/Allow Fire - Failure to comply with Permit \$250.00

Recreational Fire Permit - \$20.00 Annual Fee

Open Air Burning Permit - \$20.00 Annual Fee (A visual inspection and approval from the Fire Department is required prior to burning).

How do I keep myself and my loved ones safe?

• Ensure woodstoves, fireplaces and fireplace inserts are installed by a qualified technician according to manufacturer's instructions.

• Have your heating system, vents and chimneys inspected and cleaned annually by a qualified service technician.

• Ensure all outside heating vents are not blocked.

• Allow ashes from your woodstove or fireplace to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.

• Always use a fire screen around the fireplace!

Install smoke and carbon monoxide alarms on every storey of your home.

Test them every month.
