In emergent situations, standard use of 911 still applies. At this time, criminal record checks are still reserved for essential workers only.

DEEP RIVER BY-LAWS

Snow Depositing (5-86)

2.0- No person shall, for the purpose of cleaning or clearing of any driveway or other property or for any other purpose, deposit or cause to be deposited snow or ice from such driveway or property on any roadway.
