### Message From The Chief of Police

The COVID-19 pandemic is affecting all aspects of our lives and how we do business. In emergent situations, standard use of 911 still applies. At this time, criminal record checks are still reserved for essential workers only.

Christmas Trees may be placed curbside (making sure to not interfere with waste collection, recycling collection or snow removal services). The Town will ensure that all Christmas trees placed at the curbside will be collected by January 15, 2021.

Alternatively, Christmas trees can be dropped off free of charge at the Bags Road Landfill site.



## DEEP RIVER FIRE DEPARTMENT



Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!

- DEC JAN FEB**  
Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.
- 1 in every 7** home fires and **1 in every 5** home fire deaths involves heating equipment.
- Keep anything that can burn at **at least 3 feet** from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.
- Keep portable generators **outside, away from windows, and as far away from your home as possible.**
- Install and test carbon monoxide alarms **at least once a month.**
- Plug only **1 heat-producing appliance** (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.
- Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents **every year.**
- Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it **outside at least 10 feet** from your home and any nearby buildings.

## DEEP RIVER BY-LAWS

### Snow Depositing (5-86)

2.0- No person shall, for the purpose of cleaning or clearing of any driveway or other property or for any other purpose, deposit or cause to be deposited snow or ice from such driveway or property on any roadway.
