BICYCLE SAFETY

Rules of the road

As a cyclist, you must share the road with others (e.g., cars, buses, trucks, motorcycles, etc.).

Under Ontario's Highway Traffic Act (HTA), a bicycle is a vehicle, just like a car or truck.

Cyclists:

- must obey all traffic laws
- cannot carry passengers - if your bicycle is only meant for one person

Riding on the right You must stay as close to the right edge of the road as safely as possible.

Where you can ride You can ride on most roads, **except:**

- controlled access highways, such as Ontario's 400-series highways
 - across a road within a pedestrian crossover - you must walk your bike to the other side
 - across a road within a crosswalk at any intersection or other location with traffic signals - you must walk your bike to the other side.
- You can **NOT** ride your bicycle on any sidewalk in Deep River

Bike Helmets - Children and Youth

By law, every cyclist under age 18 must wear an approved helmet.

Riders under 16 years old: a parent or guardian must make sure their child wears a helmet.

Adults - A helmet can greatly reduce the risk of permanent injury or death if you fall or collide. It is strongly recommended that all riders wear helmets.

The best helmets are made to meet strict safety standards and fit properly when worn correctly

BE AWARE! Fire can happen anywhere.



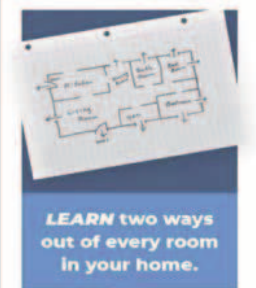
Take action to **prevent fire** from starting.



Make sure everyone knows the sound of the smoke alarms and can hear them in an emergency.

There is no time to spare in a fire.

Early detection gives you the extra seconds you need to get out safely.



Practice an escape plan with everyone in your home before a fire starts so you and your family can get out quickly.



GET OUT & STAY OUT!

When the smoke alarms sound in an emergency, get out **immediately** and call 9-1-1 from outside. **Never re-enter a burning building.**

PROVINCIAL SHUTDOWN NOTICE

Formal notice of the Deep River Community Pool and Deep River Arena closing as of April 3, 2021 in accordance with the Provincial 28-day lockdown. The Town of Deep River will continue to monitor the situation and will continue to provide updates on town situations as they become available online at www.deepriver.ca or Town of Deep River Facebook page.

In response to the third state of emergency The Town of Deep River Municipal Office will be closed until further notice. Essential appointment will be accommodated by appointment only.

The Deep River Arena will be closed as of May 1, 2021 for the duration of the season.

HYDRANT FLUSHING NOTICE

Please be advised that hydrant flushing will commence in the West end of Town beginning on Monday April 19th, 2021 and beginning in the East end of Town on Monday May 3rd, 2021.

Flushing is part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain firefighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your **COLD WATER TAPS ONLY** (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please **DO NOT** use your hot water until you have clean running water again.

SPRING CLEAN UP

The annual spring clean-up will commence on the following dates:

Monday May 3rd— WEST END

Monday May 10th—EAST END

• YARD WASTE

- Branches and Brush in biodegradable bags or bundled and tied (less than 4-inches in diameter)
- Leaf and Yard Waste in biodegradable bags

• METAL

- Pipes, Ductwork, etc.
- Propane Tanks (VALVE OPEN)
- Metal Appliances

• ELECTRONIC WASTE

- Items must be placed at the curb by 7:00 AM on the scheduled collection start date (listed above for each end of Town).
- Items may be set out as early as one week in advance of the scheduled collection start date.
- Please place material on the shoulder of the road or back lane next to your driveway.
- Only one (1) pass will be made for each street, please ensure your items are out ahead of the scheduled start date.

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP INCLUDE:

Household garbage, recyclable materials, cardboard, construction and demolition material of any kind, furniture, mattresses and box springs, carpets, large tree limbs/trunks/stumps, plastic toys, tires or household hazardous waste (HHHW) such as motor oil, gasoline, paint cans, batteries, antifreeze, etc., and any other items not listed in the accepted items list.
