SPRING CLEAN UP

The annual spring clean-up will commence on the following dates:

Monday May 3rd— WEST END
Monday May 10th—EAST END

• YARD WASTE

- Branches and Brush in biodegradable bags or bundled and tied (less than 4-inches in diameter)
- Leaf and Yard Waste in biodegradable bags

• METAL

- Pipes, Ductwork, etc.
- Propane Tanks (VALVE OPEN)
- Metal Appliances

• ELECTRONIC WASTE

- Items must be placed at the curb by 7:00 AM on the scheduled collection start date (listed above for each end of Town).
- Items may be set out as early as one week in advance of the scheduled collection start date.
- Please place material on the shoulder of the road or back lane next to your driveway.
- **Only one (1) pass will be made for each street, please ensure your items are out ahead of the scheduled start date.**

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP INCLUDE:

Household garbage, recyclable materials, cardboard, construction and demolition material of any kind, furniture, mattresses and box springs, carpets, large tree limbs/trunks/stumps, plastic toys, tires or household hazardous waste (HHHW) such as motor oil, gasoline, paint cans, batteries, antifreeze, etc., and any other items not listed in the accepted items list.

BEAR SPRINGTIME SAFETY

When out in bear country

Bears are smart, curious, powerful, and potentially dangerous. And they do not like surprises. If you are a hiker, cyclist, jogger, berry picker or you plan to spend some time in “bear country,” learn to be Bear Wise to avoid an encounter.

Avoid bear-human interactions

Alert bears to your presence so they can avoid you. Make noise, such as singing, whistling, or talking while in areas with restricted visibility or with high background noise, such as near streams and waterfalls.

While outdoors:

- travel in groups of two or more—people who travel alone are most vulnerable
- scan your surroundings and do not wear music headphones
- watch for signs of bear activity such as tracks, claw marks on trees, flipped-over rocks, or fresh bear droppings
- leash your dog, as uncontrolled, untrained dogs may lead a bear to you
- pay attention, especially if you are working, gardening or berry picking
- rise slowly if you are in a crouched position so that you do not startle nearby bears
- avoid strong fragrances that may cause a bear to be curious
- put any food you are carrying in sealed containers in your pack

Be prepared

You should:

- Carry a whistle or air horn.
- Learn how to use bear pepper spray and carry it somewhere that’s easy to access.
- Consider carrying a long handled axe if you are in remote areas or deep in the forest.

Bear fact: Discuss bears with children. Teach children simple things like making sure they can always see an adult; to never approach a bear or other animals; to never run from a bear and if they see a bear to stay calm and call for help.

LANDFILL

Millers Road Landfill: Construction & Demolition Waste

Operating hours are: Tuesday to Saturday – 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Construction & demolition waste is defined as “all non-hazardous, low metal content waste from construction and demolition clean-up projects, consisting primarily of wood, blocks/stone/bricks, non-metal roofing material, insulation, waste furniture (wood only), window glass, non-metal siding material, concrete, and small amounts of plastic and fiberglass.”

No Charge:

Recyclables, select compostable materials (branches less than 5 inches in diameter, leaves, grass clippings & garden waste), electronic and electrical equipment, scrap metal, tire recycling, hazardous waste Items include: Motor oil, paint, automotive batteries, compressed gas cylinders (ex. Propane, butane), refrigerant-containing appliances (ex. Refrigerators, dehumidifiers), gasoline, diesel fuel, solvents, heating oil, dry cell batteries, fertilizers, pesticides, antifreeze, acids, alkaline wastes, organic/inorganic chemicals, and fluorescent lights.

Hydrocarbon Contaminated Soil: Must have a completed analysis and be approved by the Coordinator (613) 584-9194.

PROVINCIAL SHUTDOWN NOTICE

Formal notice of the Deep River Community Pool and Deep River Arena closing as of April 3, 2021 in accordance with the Provincial 28-day lockdown. The Town of Deep River will continue to monitor the situation and will continue to provide updates on town situations as they become available online at www.deepriver.ca or Town of Deep River Facebook page.

In response to the third state of emergency The Town of Deep River Municipal Office will be closed until further notice. Essential appointment will be accommodated by appointment only.

The Deep River Arena will be closed as of May 1, 2021 for the duration of the season.

HYDRANT FLUSHING NOTICE

Please be advised that hydrant flushing will commence in the West end of Town beginning on Monday April 19th, 2021 and beginning in the East end of Town on Monday May 3rd, 2021.

Flushing is part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain firefighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your COLD WATER TAPS ONLY (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please DO NOT use your hot water until you have clean running water again.
