Notice of Intention to Repeal By-Law Number 23-84

Take notice that Council of the Town of Deep River hereby gives notice of their intention to repeal By-Law Number 23-84, a By-Law to Designate Certain Properties in the Town of Deep River under the Ontario Heritage Act.

This notice is provided pursuant to Section 32 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. O. 18, s. 32 (3).

On November 21, 1984 the property known municipally as 612 Highway 17 East being comprised of Part of Lots 44 and 45, Range 'A' in the Town of Deep River was designated to be of historical and architectural significance.

Following receipt of a written application by the property owner to the Town to request the Heritage designation be repealed, a comprehensive review of the designation was undertaken and on June 9, 2021 Council of the Corporation of the Town of Deep River resolved to issue a Notice of Intention to repeal By-law 23-84.

AN OBJECTION TO THE PROPOSED REPEAL MUST BE RECEIVED IN WRITING BY THE CLERK ON OR BEFORE: JULY 15, 2021.

Addresses ending in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8 may water their lawns on "even numbered calendar dates", i.e.: May 2nd, June 30th, July 18th, and August 6th.

Addresses ending in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 may water their lawns on "odd numbered calendar dates", i.e., June 3rd, July 15th, August 21st, and September 7th.

The only permitted watering hours are: 7:30 - 11am and 6 - 9pm
