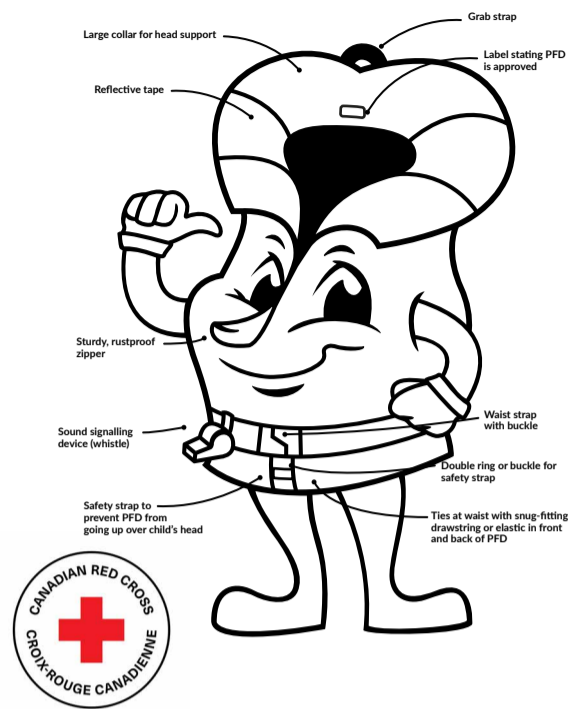

PFD CHECKLIST

- Has a Transport Canada (TC) or Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) label identifying the PFD as certified safe and effective in Canada. The label will also identify the appropriate size and weight restrictions for the user.
- Whistles (a sound signalling device) should be attached to the zipper of the PFD in case the wearer falls out of a boat. The whistle will make noise to bring help.
- All child-sized PFDs have a grab strap around the top of the PFD to help grab kids who have fallen into the water. The rescuer who grabs the strap will be in a boat or on a dock.
- A zipper closes the front of the PFD. To make the PFD safer, a buckle runs around the PFD. The buckle has a strap that can be tightened to fit a variety of sizes.
- Ties are placed at the bottom of the PFD to ensure a tight fit around the hips. This will help stop the PFD from going over the shoulders.
- Variety of colours and styles. Colours are usually bright and easy to see; red, yellow and orange are the most common.
- Around all parts of the PFD, reflective tape is used to help rescuers better see a person who has fallen into the water.
- Large collar for head support.
- No rips or tears.
- A buckle strap between the legs is common for all child-sized PFDs.



Deep River Vulnerable Person Registry

The purpose of this registry is to improve the potential for success in locating a vulnerable person should they go missing. Our Police Service does this by gathering information that will help coordinate search efforts and reduce search times. Parents, caregivers, or vulnerable persons themselves living within the Municipality of Deep River can submit this information.

Definition of a Vulnerable Person (VP)

A person who has a cognitive, physical, intellectual/developmental disability or other condition which may place the person at an increased risk of misadventure leading to injury or death and who may require assistance from emergency services.

Who can register?

Any family member/friend/vulnerable person who may suffer from these or other vulnerable conditions:

- Alzheimer's Disease
- Dementia
- Autism
- An acquired brain Injury
- Mental Health conditions
- Increasing age
- Social isolation
- A tendency to wander
- The inability to communicate
- Fascinations or attractions (water, construction sites etc.)
- Unusual social responses (fear of strangers, aggression)

Why Register?

Experience has taught us that people often delay in calling the Police to report a missing person. There are common misconceptions that you have to wait a period of time to report a missing person, this is not true. It is time consuming to obtain information and photos about the missing person and this can cause a delay in starting the search. A person can walk 6 km an hour and any delay will greatly increase the search area. By having information and a photo on file Police can more efficiently coordinate search efforts and commence searching.
