Swimming lessons will look a little different during Covid-19. This fall instructors will be teaching a hybrid program of in and out of water. At times a parent may be required to participate in the water as the hands-on helper for levels Sea Turtle to Swim Kids Level 4 or if a child needs assistance. Class sizes will be reduced. That being said, we have created a plan for all ages to enjoy swimming lessons in a family environment. We are now offering Family Swimming Lessons. Family lessons are geared for a parent(s) to be in the water with up to 2-3 children with a maximum number of 4 people being in the family pod. The instructor will teach multiple levels if required.

We ask that the parent register for the lesson under "Swimming Lessons". When you register, you will be prompted to list your children's names. It would also be helpful if you indicate their swim level. If you have questions, please contact the pool at 613-584-2000 ext. 181.

Programming will follow safety guidelines from Lifesaving Society, Red Cross and Renfrew County Public Health.

- Aquafit will be a registered program. You will be able to choose more than one class per week during the session while space is available.
- AquaTherapy will be a registered program. Drop-ins will not be permitted for any classes.
- All participants will be required to register online at https://app.bookking.ca/deepriverpub/
- For those who were registered in the winter session, your money has been refunded to your "online wallet". Your account will automatically use the money sitting in your "online wallet" before requiring additional payment from you.
- Drop-ins will not be permitted for any classes and refunds will not be issued if you are unable to attend your booked class.
- Registration is first-come-first-serve. Spaces are limited to 14 people per class due to physical distancing procedures.
- Swimmers will be COVID-19 screened prior to entering the building. Please do not attend the class if you are feeling unwell or present COVID-19 symptoms.
- We ask face masks or coverings be worn while walking and changing in the facility.

Walking to school.

Students who walk to school often must deal with traffic, weather conditions and other distractions along the way.

Teach your children the proper safety rules for walking to school by:

- Having them buddy up with a sibling, friend or designated older student to ensure that they get to school safely and on time
- Showing them the safest routes to take and discouraging "short cuts" or other deviations from the route
- Keeping their electronics stashed in their backpacks as electronics can be distractions that can make them late for school or unable to hear cars and bikes on their route

Riding bicycles to school.

Biking is great exercise for children of all ages but remember that bikes are considered vehicles too.

Teach your children proper bike safety on route to school by:

- Having them wear the right equipment, including a properly fitted bike helmet
- Instructing them how to maintain their bicycles so that mechanical issues do not slow them down
- Showing them the right routes and going on a test ride to ensure they know the way
- Educating them on the rules of the road to make sure they stay safe
