Hydrant Flushing Notice

Please be advised that hydrant flushing will commence in the West end of Town beginning on Monday, October 18th, 2021 and beginning in the East end of Town on Monday, November 1st, 2021.

Flushing will run until November 12th, 2021 but may be extended due to unforeseeable circumstances, please check the NRT and Town website for any changes to these dates.

Flushing is part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain firefighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your **COLD WATER TAPS ONLY** (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please **DO NOT** use your hot water until you have clean running water again.

Prevent Getting Lost

This time of year, Deep River and area is a beautiful place to enjoy the outdoors. However, the weather can be unpredictable, and trails may look different with the changes to the vegetation and trees. The Deep River Police Service would like to remind everyone that if you go hiking to remember to bring a few essential items and that the weather can change rapidly throughout the day and night.

Items to bring:

Map
Whistle
Cell Phone
1-2 liters of water
First Aid Kit
Flashlight
Matches, Pocket knife
Extra Clothes including hat, gloves, jacket.

Tips to avoid getting lost:

Stay on well-marked trails
Never hike alone
Check the weather before you leave
Let someone know where you will be hiking
Know how to use and follow the map
Be aware of your surroundings

What to do if you are lost:

Stay dry
Blow your whistle
Look for trail markers
Use your cell phone
Look around for a safe sheltered place
Don't panic

By being prepared you will enjoy your trip, reduce the chance of getting lost and if you do get lost, you'll be able to help others find you quickly and keep yourself safe and warm while you wait.
