Yard waste will be collected the week of November 1st to 5th, 2021. Leaves, pine needles and plants must be placed at the curb in **biodegradable brown paper bags** no later than 7:00 AM on November 1st, 2021.

We will do our best to pick up broken bags but will not rake contents that have been spilled out of bags.

**Only one pass will be made for each street so please ensure that your bags are out no later than 7:00 AM on November 1st, 2021.**

Tree branches and other brush will not be picked up but can be taken to the Baggs Road Landfill site throughout the year at no charge.

## Hydrant Flushing Notice

Please be advised that hydrant flushing will commence in the West end of Town beginning on Monday, October 18th, 2021 and beginning in the East end of Town on Monday, November 1st, 2021.

Flushing will run until November 12th, 2021 but may be extended due to unforeseeable circumstances, please check the NRT and Town website for any changes to these dates.

Flushing is part of a routine maintenance program that is necessary to maintain the integrity of the water system, remove sediment from water mains, verify the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and maintain firefighting capability.

Residents throughout Town may experience a drop in water pressure and water may be rusty or cloudy due to flushing of the distribution system. If you have rust-coloured water please run your **COLD WATER TAPS ONLY** (suggested taps: outside hose, bathtub or laundry tub) until the water is clear.

Please **DO NOT** use your hot water until you have clean running water again.

### Cyber Security Awareness Month

Cyber Security Awareness Month is an internationally recognized campaign held each October to help the public learn more about the importance of cyber security. This campaign helps Canadian stay secure online by teaching them simple steps to protect themselves and their devices.

No matter what's going on around us, the internet keeps us in touch and spending time with our favorite people. Using strong passphrases and complex passwords for every account and device is one of the best ways to keep your personal information safe. Passphrases, passwords and PINs help protect your personal information from potential online threats. And the stronger they are, the more secure your information will be. We recommend that you use passphrases, as they are longer yet easier to remember than a password. A passphrase is a memorized phrase consisting of mixed words with or without spaces.

If a passphrase isn't an option, complex passwords that are unique to every account and device can also make it more difficult for cyber criminals to access your accounts and devices. This one should be obvious, but just in case it's not: never, ever, ever share your password with anyone. Ever.
