Town History

The Town of Deep River has a rich history surrounding scientific development and research. Originally a planned community, the Town was developed in the 1940's to house employees at the Chalk River Nuclear Laboratories. Researchers at this facility developed Canada's first nuclear reactors and produced medical isotopes, causing the Town of Deep River to adopt the name "Canada's Nuclear Pioneers."

Arts & Culture

Our community has a broad range of diverse backgrounds, creating a unique vibrant atmosphere that fosters creativity and individuality. Deep River is home to a large variety of artists. Those who participate in the visual arts will find community with a variety of local groups, including the Deep River Potters' Guild and the Valley Artisans Co-operative. Others who are musically inclined are encouraged to join the Deep River Symphony Orchestra, Deep River Choral Group, or Deep River Community Band, all of which host events throughout the year. And several local and regional theatre groups cater to dramatic arts lovers.

Deep River Summerfest, organized by a very dedicated committee of volunteers is a festival held once every two years showcasing many local and famous artists.

In the summer months, enjoy roaming the local Farmers Market and head to the waterfront after to catch local musicians showcasing their skills and talents.

Deep River is proud to host to two museums: the Canadian Clock Museum, and the Society for the Preservation of Canada's Nuclear Heritage.



Recreational Clubs

The Town and local community groups and associations, runs a large variety of recreational programs, events, and facilities for all ages.

Deep River contains numerous recreational facilities, such as our community pool, arena, marina, and a variety of beaches. In the summer months, residents spend time enjoying the Ottawa River, marina and life-guarded beach. In the winter, it is not uncommon to see families skating on the outdoor skating rinks and arena, cross country skiing, downhill skiing and snowboarding at Mount Martin, the local ski hill, or ice fishing on the Ottawa River. Year round, the Town and community groups host events and festivals like the Canada Day Celebration, Winter Carnival, Geek Fest, cross river swim and the triathlon. The Town also runs a variety of sports programming, year-round aquatics programming & swimming lessons and summer camps for youth. Facilities can be rented throughout the year, and sports fields can be rented in the summer.

The Town is also home to a large selection of clubs and groups, such as the Deep River Cross Country Ski Club, who run the Silver Spoon Ski-Fest each year, Deep River Shoreline Sports Club, which hosts a variety of activities and programming, notably their pickleball & tennis leagues,

and a youth sailing program. Deep River is also home to the Deep River Knights

Minor Hockey Association and the Deep River Skating Club.

Waste Collection

Household Waste

Household waste is collected according to the street schedule. On your scheduled pickup day, household waste bins and bags must be placed at the curb (end of driveway), preferably no later than 7:00 a.m.. There is a two bag limit for residential household waste collection.

The Town actively encourages all residents to recycle. Recycling is picked up alongside household waste and will alternate pickup, with fibers (cardboard, paper) on one week, and containers (plastic, glass) on the next week. There is no limit for recyclable items. As of January 1st, 2025 the collection of residential recyclable items is the responsibility of the producer. Please contact Miller Waste for any inquiries:

Trails, Green Space's & Parks

The Town of Deep River is home to an extensive network of indoor and outdoor recreational parks and facilities. Currently the Town operates and maintains nine parks scattered throughout the community which offer fun for all ages.

The community also takes pride in its 70 km of trails, most of which are maintained by volunteers. The trails are multi-use year round, with some having specific use for snowshoeing or cross-country skiing in the winter months.

Off Road Vehicles (ORVs)

Off road vehicles as defined in by-law 20-2023 are allowed on all roads in Deep River. The allowed speed limit is 20km/h, and ORV's need to be registered & insured. Drivers must be 16 years of age and carry a valid license.

ORV's are not allowed to be used on or through any parks, beaches, sports fields, cemeteries, or any public trails. ORV's with fewer than four wheels are

Emergency Services

The **Deep River Fire Department** is a composite department, consisting of a fire chief, four full time firefighters, and twenty-six volunteer firefighters. The Fire hall is staffed between 07:00 and 17:00 Monday to Friday, with an on-call system during non-business hours.

- Public fire & life safety education,
- Fire prevention programs
- Inspection programs (enforcement)
- Emergency response such as but not limited to fire suppression, auto extrication and medical response

The Deep River Police Service offers a number of additional services to the residents of Deep River:

Vacant House Checks - When leaving for a weekend or longer, your insurance usually requires that someone be left to check on your residence.

Criminal Record Checks & Fingerprinting - Many employers and volunteer organisations require new employees and volunteers to provide documentation reporting on their criminal record status.

FOI Requests - The Deep River Police Service is subject to the Freedom and Information Act. Requests under the FOI can be submitted to the Service in writing along with a \$5.00 fee. **Record Copies** - A request for a report record or letter can be made in person or in writing.



Library

The Deep River Public Library offers a wide range of resources for information, education, and entertainment.

All are welcome to borrow, take part in our programs, or sit and chat by the fireplace. Membership is free to anyone who lives or owns property in the area. Stop by the library with proof of address to sign up! Junior members (under 13) require a parent or guardian to sign their registration and take responsibility for their child's borrowing. Non-residents may join for an annual fee of \$20.

Some key library services include:
A wide-ranging collection of 42,000 books, magazines, DVDs, audiobooks, and CDs in-library.

- Electronic access to 101,000 eBooks, eMagazines, and eAudiobooks.
- Free access to Kanopy film streaming, language and learning platforms, and research databases.
- Library of Things items for loan, such as museum passes, Ontario Parks day passes, board games, play kits, costumes, Explorer Back-Packs, and outdoor equipment through the Town's Hub!
- Local historical material, including NRTs on microfilm, for in-library perusal. Join our Community Memory Vault project to share stories of the early days, or browse our online material via our website.
- Home delivery (and pick-up) services available.
- Technology services: free WiFi, six public computers available on a first-come, first-serve basis, and printing, scanning, and faxing services available (for a fee).

The library also offers a range of programs for all ages, from Storytimes, Lego club, and summer reading fun, to adult book clubs, crafting, writers' group, and special presentations. Check out the event calendar on our website or follow us on Facebook for current programs! The library also has an 1,00 square foot elevator-accessible program room available for private or community group rentals.

More than 100 volunteers support the library. The Friends of the Library group is responsible for fundraising efforts like our giant book sale. The Library Arts

Committee is responsible for art shows in our program room. New volunteers are always welcome. Get involved today!

Pets

In the Town of Deep River, all pets (dogs and cats) must have tags. These tags are necessary to keep your furry friends safe in case of an accident or runaway. Tags are valid for the life of the pet and are available for purchase at the Town Hall.

Deep River is home to a lot of wild animals. If there is an non-emergent incident regarding a wild animal, please phone the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry at 1-866-514-2327. If there is an emergency, call 911.

Building Inspector & Bylaw Officer

The Town also has a Bylaw Officer who helps residents comply with the Town's by-laws, and investigates infraction concerns. Some of the most common questions relate to noise, backyard hens, parking, and property standards.

Our Building inspector is here to serve as a vital link between the construction industry, regulatory authorities, and the public, ensuring that buildings meet the necessary standards for structural stability, fire safety, accessibility, and overall compliance with applicable regulations.
