6. DELEGATIONS & PRESENTATIONS

Certificate Presentation – Ed Wadleigh and Family

Mayor Thompson presented Sergeant Ed Wadleigh and his family, wife Nicola and sons Jack and Sam, with a certificate of appreciation. Mayor Thompson read the certificate as follows: "The Corporation of the Town of Deep River takes pride in presenting this scroll to the Wadleigh Family, Thank you for serving your country and community. On behalf of all military families, please accept this acknowledgement of our eternal gratitude. Deep River is enriched by your presence." 6.2 Energy Audit – Jp2g Consultants Inc.

Joe Janota and Jim Gordon of Jp2g Consultants Inc. provided an overview of the energy audit conducted by their firm on 10 municipal buildings. The recommendations compiled from the energy audit include the following:

1. <u>Proposed Energy Retrofit Projects:</u>

Pool – new domestic hot water tank Pool – cast iron boiler repleacement Arena – heat reclaim Arena – domestic hot water replacement Arena – ice plant control system

- 6.3 Farmers' Market Janice Francisco and Andrew Bergeron

Janice Francisco and Andrew Bergeron (via Skype) provided an overview of their request for funding to start a Farmers' Market in Deep River. It was noted the start up funds would be used for the following: Farmers' Market Ontario membership fee; local advertising; hiring a graphic artist to market the Farmers' Market; and signage; for an estimated budget of \$3,000.00.

6.4 Festival Hall Committee – Gary Severin, Jane Lavoy, and Catherine Timm

Gary Severin, Catherine Timm, and Jane Lavoy provided an overview of the Festival Hall Committee and the Valley Arts Council. It was noted the Festival Hall Committee is comprised of a consortium of three municipalities: the City of Pembroke, the Township of Laurentian Valley, and the Town of Petawawa. Each member municipality provides a per capita grant in the amount of 0.75¢ which is provided to the Valley Arts Council to manage Festival Hall on behalf of the consortium. The Festival Hall Committee/Valley Arts Council is requesting financial support in the form of a grant from municipalities within Renfrew County whose residents are participants or patrons of the arts in order to increase access to quality local and professional arts programming at Festival Hall. A copy of the 2011 budget for Festival Hall will be provided at a future date for council to consider a grant allocation in the municipality's 2012 budget deliberations.
